

Executive Order 2003.001

Interfraternity Council / Panhellenic Association
“Creation of the Distinguished Service Award”

Whereas, the Interfraternity Council and Panhellenic Association receive benefits from many advisors, alumni, faculty, staff, parents, and friends;

Whereas, it is appropriate to give recognition and thanks to individuals who have given time, resources, and/or other gifts to the two councils;

Whereas, the highest award currently given is that of “Chapter Advisor of the Year” – normally only one per year per council;

Whereas, a need exists to recognize individuals beyond the chapter advisor level, to include service to the councils and/or extraordinary service to one or a few chapters which in turn greatly assists the entire Purdue fraternity/sorority community;

Therefore, be it enacted by Executive Board Order, that the Distinguished Service Award be created as the highest award given to an individual by the Panhellenic Association and/or the Interfraternity Council at Purdue.

Be it further enacted that the award may be given at any time of the year, and upon the authority of either or both council executive boards from nominations by the board itself, advisors, chapters, or other members of the university community.

Be it further enacted that each award be numbered in sequence and properly logged in the council archives and website, with David Huhnke of Sigma Phi Epsilon being given number 1 as the inaugural recipient of this award.
