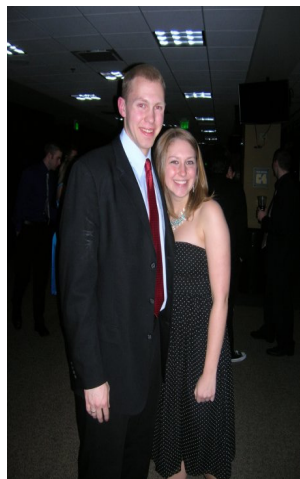

Things to Remember
